Alamo Watershed Study

Mitman Neighborhood has an opportunity to fix some stormwater drainage problems during our summer monsoon deluges. Tucson City Stormwater and Pima County Flood Control are coordinating their efforts. Problem areas on Van Buren, Fourth Street dip, the Fifth Street school crossing, and Chantilly next to the Sewell School are areas of concern. We will be looking for property owners who have stormwater problems to give us input on the extent of the flood plain in our area.

Why Do We Have Code Enforcement?

City and county government budgets are not large enough to resolve the litter and weed problems in our community. Tucson Clean & Beautiful (TCB) works in partnership with both city and county governments to help maintain Tucson's beautiful environment. Sincere community commitment, involvement and ownership have made this program highly successful.

What Should Be the Neighborhood's Part in All of This?

Code Enforcement is the Tucson City government setting standards for property maintenance and safety issues. It is their way of setting community standards for what should be a good neighbor, and minimize safety issues and promote a habitable neighborhood. This takes a community effort to achieve. And I am proud to say that Mitman Neighborhood is all right in my estimation. Keep battling those summer weed outbursts in our yards and alleys.

Can the Neighborhood Adopt a Park or Public Area?

Any recognized community group willing to make an ongoing volunteer commitment throughout the year may participate. Civic associations, schools, neighborhoods, churches, military, scout and other community groups as well as businesses have made an ongoing commitment to clean up and control litter. This could be a community project to make the neighborhood better and safer!
